Annual Report for the Academic Year 2020/2021

Background

The Swedish Research School of Management and IT (MIT) is a national research school launched by the Swedish Government in the year 2000 with Uppsala University as host institution. Today, MIT is a networked research school comprising management and IT related departments at twelve Swedish tertiary institutions: Blekinge Institute of Technology, Gothenburg University, Jönköping International Business School, Karlstad University, Linköping University, Linnaeus University, Lund University, Mälardalen University College, Stockholm University, Umeå University, Uppsala University and Örebro University. Doctoral Candidates at the Research School

The total number of postgraduate students admitted to the Research School since its inauguration is 281 (as of June 2021). In the spring of 2021 there were 95 doctoral candidates in the research school. 48 % of these were male and 52 % female. Currently, 60 % hold doctoral positions funded entirely or partly by the research school.

Doctoral Courses

During the academic year four mandatory doctoral courses were held at Uppsala and Lund. A number of doctoral students not affiliated with MIT requested and obtained permission to enroll in particular courses. Each fully approved course accounts for 7.5 credits.

Supervision and Seminars during the Academic Year

Two conferences of two days each were held during the academic year with participation by the professors of the Executive Board and additional supervisors from the various institutions. The first conference, MITAC 2020, was held online at Uppsala University on September 29-30, 2020. At this seminar the work of the doctoral candidates was presented and discussed. Introductory presentations were followed by comments and questions from doctoral candidates, with concluding comments by senior faculty members. A plenary session on theories and perspectives was held with Anna Bengtson, Ulla Ericsson-Zetterquist, Magnus Hansson, Jan Löwstedt and Fredrik Nilsson in the panel.

The second seminar, MITSC 2021, was held online at Linnaeus University on March 18-19, 2021. The seminar was planned to be given in Kalmar, but due to the pandemic it was moved online and shortened one day. At this seminar the work of the doctoral candidates was presented and discussed. Introductory presentations were followed by comments and questions from doctoral candidates, with concluding comments by senior faculty members. Three key-note speeches were given by Gerald Midgley, Hull University, Jim Spohrer, IBM and Professor Frantz Rowe, University of Nantes.

Several doctoral candidates and senior faculty members attended international conferences and published results of their research in peer-reviewed international journals during the academic year.

The Website of the Research School

During this academic year the research school's website (<u>www.mit.uu.se</u>), has been continuously updated by Golondrian Janke and Carina Boson, aided by the contact persons in the participating universities and university colleges.

The MIT Alumni Association

Under the leadership of Associate Professor Peter Ekman, the MIT Alumni Association had 131 members by the end of June 2021. Approximately 15 alumni attended MITAC 2019 and MITSC 2020 as senior faculty. During 2020/2021, the sixth and seventh issue of the MIT Alumni Letter, which is a newsletter created and edited by Peter Ekman, was sent out to the alumni of the research school.
