Annual Report for the Academic Year 2019/2020

Background

The Swedish Research School of Management and IT (MIT) is a national research school launched by the Swedish Government in the year 2000 with Uppsala University as host institution. Today, MIT is a networked research school comprising management and IT related departments at 12 Swedish tertiary institutions: Blekinge Institute of Technology, Gothenburg University, Jönköping International Business School, Karlstad University, Linköping University, Linnaeus University, Lund University, Mälardalen University College, Stockholm University, Umeå University, Uppsala University and Örebro University. Doctoral Candidates at the Research School

Fourteen doctoral candidates were admitted to the Research School in 2019/2020 (seven female and seven male). The Research School funds 8 of these partly; the remaining 6 are associated doctoral candidates with funding directly from sources other than MIT. The majority of these candidates began their studies in the academic year 2019/2020 at the official opening of the Research School in early September 2019.

The total number of postgraduate students admitted to the Research School since its inauguration is 263 (as of June 2020). In the spring of 2020 there were 83 doctoral candidates at the Research School. 55 % of these were male and 45 % female. Currently, 59 % hold doctoral positions funded entirely or partly by the Research School.

Doctoral Courses

During the academic year four mandatory doctoral courses were held at Uppsala and Lund. A number of doctoral students not affiliated with MIT requested and obtained permission to enroll in particular courses. Each fully approved course accounts for 7.5 credits.

Supervision and Seminars during the Academic Year

Two conferences of three days each were held during the academic year with participation by the professors of the Executive Board and additional supervisors from the various institutions. The first conference, MITAC 2019, was held in Uppsala at Uppsala University on October 21-23, 2019. At this seminar the work of the doctoral candidates was presented and discussed. Introductory presentations were followed by comments and questions from doctoral candidates, with concluding comments by senior faculty members. A key-note speech was given by Professor Robin Teigland, Chalmers.

The second seminar, MITSC 2020, was held at Mälardalen University College March 18-19, 2020. It was planned to be given in Västerås 18-20 March, but due to the pandemic it was on short notice moved online and shortened one day to 18-19 March. At this seminar the work of the doctoral candidates was presented and discussed. Introductory presentations were followed by comments and questions from doctoral candidates, with concluding comments by senior faculty members.

Several doctoral candidates and senior faculty members attended international conferences and published results of their research in various international journals during the academic year.

The Website of the Research School

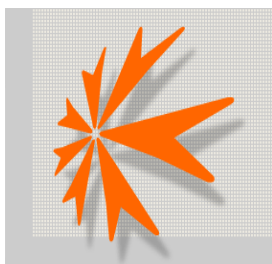
