Annual Report for the Academic Year 2016/2017

Background

The Swedish Research School of Management and IT (MIT) is a national research school launched by the Swedish Government in the year 2000 with Uppsala University as host institution. Today, MIT is a networked research school comprising management and IT related departments at 13 Swedish tertiary institutions: Blekinge Institute of Technology, Chalmers University of Technology, Gothenburg University, Jönköping International Business School, Karlstad University, Linköping University, Linnaeus University, Lund University, Mälardalen University College, Stockholm University, Umeå University, Uppsala University and Örebro University. The total number of postgraduate students admitted to the Research School since its inauguration is 217 (as of June, 2017). In the spring of 2017 there were 90 doctoral candidates at the Research School. 60 % of these were male and 40 % female. All postgraduate students have

prepared approved plans of study. 15 new doctoral candidates began their studies at the School in the autumn of 2017, five female and 10 male.

Doctoral Courses

During the academic year four doctoral courses were held at Uppsala and Lund. A number of doctoral students not affiliated with MIT requested and obtained permission to enrol in particular courses. Each fully approved course accounts for 7.5 credits.

Supervision and Seminars during the Academic Year

Two seminars of three days each were held during the academic year with participation by the professors of the Executive Board and additional supervisors from the various institutions. The first seminar was held in Uppsala on October 3–5, 2016. This seminar was modelled on the annual Information Systems Research in Scandinavia Seminar (IRIS) and consisted of working groups in which doctoral candidates presented and discussed their on-going work with senior faculty. A submission and peer-review process that allowed for feedback and preparation for the seminar preceded the event.

The second seminar was held in Karlskrona, BTH, March 13–15, 2017. At this seminar the work of the doctoral candidates was presented and discussed. Introductory presentations were followed by comments and questions from doctoral candidates, with concluding comments by professors and associate professors. There were also seminars conducted by guest speakers, all of which were well attended and appreciated.

In collaboration with the Department of Business Studies at Uppsala University, the Uppsala Lectures in Business 2016 were held on October 4-5, 2016. Professor Andrew Van de Ven, University of Minnesota, USA, gave two lectures: "Engaged Scholarship", and "Managing Knowledge Integration Across Boundaries".

Several doctoral candidates and senior faculty members attended international conferences and published results of their research in various international journals during the academic year.

The Website of the Research School

Since the launch of the research school website (www.mit.uu.se) in 2015, Carina Boson and Elisabeth Hallmén have worked hard to keep it current, aided by the contact persons in the participating universities and university colleges.

The MIT Alumni Association

Under the leadership of Professor Christina Keller, the MIT Alumni Association had 103 members by the end of June 2017. Approximately 30 alumni attended MITAC 2016 and MITSC 2017 as senior faculty. An alumni meeting was held in March 2017 during the MITSC seminar at Blekinge Institute of Technology.

The Management of the Research School

At the beginning of the academic year 2016/2017, Professor Lars Engwall left his position as chairman, which he had held since the start of the research school in 2000. Professor Fredrik Nilsson was appointed as chairman with Professor Fredrik Tell as deputy chairman.

Professor Pär Ågerfalk left his position as Dean of the research school on July 1, 2017, which he had held since 2010, and was succeeded by Professor Christina Keller.
