Annual Report for the Academic Year 2017/2018

Background

The Swedish Research School of Management and IT (MIT) is a national research school launched by the Swedish Government in the year 2000 with Uppsala University as host institution. Today, MIT is a networked research school comprising management and IT related departments at 13 Swedish tertiary institutions: Blekinge Institute of Technology, Chalmers University of Technology, Gothenburg University, Jönköping International Business School, Karlstad University, Linköping University, Linnaeus University, Lund University, Mälardalen University College, Stockholm University, Umeå University, Uppsala University and Örebro University. Doctoral Candidates at the Research School

17 doctoral candidates were admitted to the Research School in 2017/2018 (eleven male and six female). The Research School funds ten of these partly; the remaining seven are associated doctoral candidates with funding directly from sources other than MIT. The majority of these candidates began their studies in the academic year 2017/2018 at the official opening of the Research School in early September 2017.

The total number of postgraduate students admitted to the Research School since its inauguration is 234 (as of June, 2018). In the spring of 2018 there were 91 doctoral candidates at the Research School. 60 % of these were male and 40 % female. Currently, 60 % hold doctoral positions funded entirely or partly by the Research School. All postgraduate students have prepared approved plans of study. 13 new doctoral candidates began their studies at the School in the autumn of 2018, eight female and five male.

Doctoral Courses

During the academic year four doctoral courses were held at Uppsala and Lund. A number of doctoral students not affiliated with MIT requested and obtained permission to enrol in particular courses. Each fully approved course accounts for 7.5 credits.

Supervision and Seminars during the Academic Year

Two seminars of three days each were held during the academic year with participation by the professors of the Executive Board and additional supervisors from the various institutions. The first seminar was held in Uppsala on September 25-27, 2017. This seminar was modelled on the annual Information Systems Research in Scandinavia Seminar (IRIS) and consisted of working groups in which doctoral candidates presented and discussed their on-going work with senior faculty. A submission and peer-review process that allowed for feedback and preparation for the seminar preceded the event. During the seminar the participants had the opportunity to listen to

the *Uppsala Lectures in Business 2017*, Professor Nicole Coviello, Lazaridis School of Business & Economics, Wilfrid Laurier University, Ontario, Canada. She gave two lectures: "Informing the dynamics of effectuation with network theory" and "No business experience required? The influence of pre-founding R&D collaboration on early internationalization".

The second seminar was held in Lund, Department of Design Sciences, Faculty of Engineering LTH, on March 12-14, 2018. At this seminar the work of the doctoral candidates was presented and discussed. Introductory presentations were followed by comments and questions from doctoral candidates, with concluding comments by senior faculty members. There were also seminars conducted by guest speakers, all of which were well attended and appreciated.

Several doctoral candidates and senior faculty members attended international conferences and published results of their research in various international journals during the academic year.

The Website of the Research School

Since the launch of the Research School website (<u>www.mit.uu.se</u>) in 2015, Carina Boson and Elisabeth Hallmén have worked continuously to keep it updated, aided by the contact persons in the participating universities and university colleges.


The MIT Alumni Association

Approximately 20 alumni attended MITAC 2017 and MITSC 2018 as senior faculty.
